A Garden In Every Lot, a program of UNI's Center for Energy and Environmental Education, aims to renew our community's culture of backyard gardening. We help individuals and community organizations overcome barriers to starting a garden. We offer garden site assessment & preparation, tilling, seeds, plant starts, and manage the Highland Park and Central Christian Church Community Gardens!

New Gardens in 2024

Bringing us to a total of 193 gardens planted in 8 cities across the cedar valley since the start of our program! \$26,137

In produce sold to the Northeast Iowa Food Bank from Congolese Producers at the Highland Park Community Garden

Of new gardeners surveyed said they felt more confident in growing their own food and plan to continue gardening in the future!









COMMUNITY GARDENS

In April of this year we established the new Central Christian Church Garden and doubled the size of the Highland Park Community Garden, which equals 2 acres of turf converted to gardens! 58 households participated.

TOOL LIBRARY

In 2022, we helped establish a Tool Library at the Waterloo Public Library. Since then, a collection of 64 gardening tools has circulated a total of 304 times!

EDUCATION

BHC Soil & Water Conservation District taught 4 workshops and led a demonstration plot at Highland Park Community Garden. Green lowa led a demonstration plot at Central Christian Church. Community Garden.


RENEWING OUR REGION'S CULTURE OF BACKYARD GARDENING
