Since replacing the Buy Fresh Buy Local brand in 2020, Grow. Eat. Play. has been embraced across multiple Iowa regions, driving a shift toward a thriving culture of local food. ## Criteria

Grow.Eat.Play. members must be a local producer or business that meets one of the following:

- Produces, processes, prepares or sells a food(s) or beverage(s) in Iowa that meet or exceed the minimum product criteria below.
- Buys at least two or more foods or beverages in Iowa that meet or exceed the minimum product criteria below.
- A farmers market in Black Hawk County or a surrounding county.
- A Community Garden in Black Hawk County or a surrounding county.
- An organization in Black Hawk County or a surrounding county that supports local foods.
- Be in good standing with and currently reside or conduct business in the state of Iowa.

### Cedar Valley Grow.Eat.Play Product Criteria

- Fresh produce and commodities must be 100 percent grown or raised in Iowa.
- Meat and meat products must be derived from animals born, raised and finished in Iowa.
- Dairy products must be from animals in Iowa and processing must take place in a state-inspected plant located in the state of Iowa.
- Eggs must be from animals in Iowa.
- Apicultural products produced by honeybees, including honey, wax, pollen and propolis must be 100 percent of Iowa origin. Honey products must utilize honey that is 100 percent of Iowa origin.
- Beer or cider must be produced in Iowa and contain at least one Iowa agricultural product, such as Iowa malt, hops, apples, corn, or soluble remnant, excluding water.
- Wine must contain a minimum of 75 percent Iowa grapes.
- Spirits must be distilled in Iowa and contain at least one Iowa agricultural product, excluding water.
